The Weather Glass

The Weather Glass is an early 19th century maritime product with lots of history, but redesigned by Inca in a new exclusive and modern Danish design.

The first documented use of a Weather Glass on a ship was the HMS Beagle's 1831-1836 circumnavigation. Robert FitzRoy, father of the British Meteorological Service, captained the ship, and famed naturalist Charles Darwin was the ecology expert onboard.

FitzRoy later published the various crystal patterns that would develop within a weather glass according to different wind directions and weather conditions.

Inca Recommends

- The Weather Glass should be placed at a northwestbound wall.
- Does not function in direct sunlight.
- Does not stand to be near any airconditions nor

any heating devices.

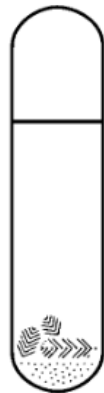
- Do not break the seal in the bottom of the glass!
- The enigmatic ability will be interrupted for up to 24 hours if you touch the glass or the metal holding it. Keep the magic inside.

The illustrations below will help you to understand the most basic weather indications.



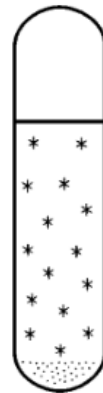
Fernlike crystals building up

Stormy



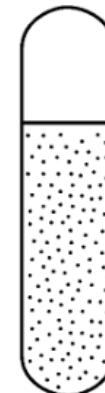
Fernlike crystals disappearing

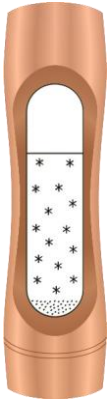
